



SYNOPSIS

The Funeral Singers is an offbeat comedy series following Harry, an unemployed copywriter who starts an unorthodox funeral service company with his oddball partners: Ben O'Toole, a cynical Irish pub manager/musician, and Charlene, a tech-savvy millennial bartender. Their unique selling proposition? Turning deceased troublemakers into beloved angels through humorous eulogies and irreverent musical tributes.

Each episode sees the team tackling a new "client," with Harry applying his advertising skills to spin the deceased's life story into a comedic three-minute roast, while Ben composes and performs personalized musical numbers highlighting the departed's foibles. However, their plans consistently go awry due to demanding family members and difficult clients, forcing Charlene to step in and salvage the situation.

Beyond the funeral hijinks, Harry juggles a complicated personal life: co-parenting his musically gifted teenage son Jack with his ex-wife Jo-Anne (who left him for a woman), dealing with his sexually liberated, hard-drinking mother Mildred, and navigating a will-they-won't-they relationship with Fayette. His weekly poker games, where he consistently loses, only add to his mounting problems.

The series combines workplace comedy with family drama, featuring a diverse cast of characters and musical performances ranging from street buskers to pub bands. At its heart, The Funeral Singers explores how humor can heal grief, while showcasing how even the most dysfunctional people can find redemption – whether they're alive or dead.





Reimagining the staid funeral industry and replacing cold, traditional services with personalized, humor-filled celebrations of life The Funeral Singers caters to the needs of this market. While maintaining an irreverent tone, the series explores how this misfit team finds purpose and redemption through their unconventional work. As they help others cope with mortality through comedy, they discover their own paths to healing and connection.

Ultimately, the episodes are about love, the love of a lost one, as seen through the heart warming and hilarious funeral scenes, a reflection itself of changing beliefs and attitudes toward death and dying. It is also about love and romantic tension, a father's love for his son, as well as Harry and Ben who are both looking for love.

Cinematography




Style

Harry's wise cracking mother. When she's not trolling senior's homes selling single joints, Mildred supplements her pension by running an S&M business out of her home. Crack!


Cast Wishlist GABRIEL ROSE


MICHAEL MAITLAND
